Proposed BMPOA Policy Regarding Invasive Species

Big Moose Lake, an exceptionally beautiful Adirondack lake, is presently free of invasive species. Other lakes in both near and distant areas of New York State and beyond are infected with invasive species whose presence dramatically reduces the enjoyment of those using the affected lakes. Big Moose Lake residents are committed to keeping our lake free of invasive species.

It is the policy of the Big Moose Property Owners Association that no boats, equipment or float planes that have been operated in other waters are to be placed in Big Moose Lake unless they come from invasive-free water or are inspected before launch and determined to be free of any invasive species.
